DEFINITIONS S&P 500 Quality High Dividend Index The S&P 500 Quality High Dividend Index measures the performance of S&P 500 stocks that exhibit both high quality and high dividend yield characteristics. Index constituents are equally-weighted, subject to a 25% Global Industry Classification Standard (GICS) Sector weight S&P 500 Index S&P 500 Index tracks the performance of 500 leading U.S. stocks and captures approximately 80% coverage of available U.S. market capitalization. It is widely regarded as the best single gauge of large-cap U.S. equities. Return on Equity Return on Equity is a measure of profitability based on a firm's 12 month earnings divided by its book value. Accruals are a measure of the quality of a firm's earnings, the accruals ratio is the change in net operating assets over the last 12 months Accruals divided by the average net operating assets over the same period. Financial Leverage Financial Leverage ratio is a measure of a company's indebtedness, based on debt to total assets. 12-Month Trailing Distribution (%) The distribution as a percentage an investor would have received if they had held the fund over the last twelve months, assuming the most recent NAV. The 12-Month Trailing Distribution (%) is calculated by summing any income, capital gains and return of capital distributions over the past twelve months and dividing by the sum of the most recent NAV and any capital gain distributions made over the same period.
